Mr Yordanov has built a new planter for Leo class and the children have been working hard preparing it ready to start planting bulbs and seeds.







First the children gathered small branches and sticks to fill the base, followed by a layer of dead leaves - this provides a warm base for the plants as it starts to rot. They then got compost from the big compost bins and added this to the raised beds. They've decided they want to grow salad crops (lettuce, cucumber etc), strawberries, some vegetables like beans, carrots and onions and some flowers for the polinators!
