P.E

Year 3 class will have PE on a Tuesday and Friday afternoon. Please ensure your child has a full PE kit in school every day, including warmer clothes for cold weather. Please ensure all items are named to avoid any confusion. Earrings must be removed for PE lessons. If your child is unable to do this themselves, please take these out yourself before sending them to school.

Homework

Your child is expected to read *every day* for about ten minutes. Where possible, we would appreciate it if you could hear your child read and make a comment in their journal. We recommend the children read a range of books which may include non-fiction or books from

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home. **The homework tasks.** Once per half term the children will access a variety of tasks using the Seesaw web site application and are expected to complete 7 tasks. Children will be receiving instructions about this and if needed, their personal logins in the next few weeks.

English

Writing – Over the course of the year, the children will explore a variety of writing genres. These will include reports, explanations and persuasive texts. In their writing we will be looking at description, writing to engage the reader and developing their characters.

Spellings - The children will be bringing spelling words home to learn each week. In line with the new curriculum, we will be taking a more investigative approach and teaching the children a variety of strategies to help them improve their spelling. They will bring home the words on a Monday, learn them over the week and be tested on them the following Monday.

Children who are accessing phonics will be given spelling related to the sounds they are learning that week.

Maths

Mental arithmetic is of great importance, with a particular focus on times tables (x3, x4 and x8 in particular). Please support your child in learning their times tables regularly.

Children are encouraged to use a range of strategies in maths. Any help is appreciated, however if you are unsure of the various strategies used for calculations please speak to your child's class teachers. This half term we are particularly focusing on Place Value of 3-digit numbers, addition and subtraction of 3-digit numbers, perimeter, using metres, centimetres and millimetres.

Uniform

The children have started the year looking very smart and your help with this is appreciated. Please remember that jewellery (apart from plain studs) is not allowed in school and shoes should be appropriate for the school environment. Hair gel and closely shaven hair is not permitted along with hair pieces. Tracksuits are allowed in winter for outdoor PE only and should be plain and labelled with their name.

No sweets or fizzy drinks are permitted in school. Children are allowed to have fruit at break times as a snack and are encouraged to drink water throughout the day.

Please can we also remind all parents and carers that Loseley Fields is a nut free school.
