Africa is the second largest continent








Deserts, great lakes, waterfalls are all physical features of Africa.

Penguins live in Antarctica (South)

4) Where in the world can we find rainforests and what are they like?

The Amazon rainforest is the habitat for over 3 million species.

The Antarctica and the Artic have significantly less species.



There is more **vegetation** and food sources for animals in the rainforest.

6) How are the features of the savannah similar or different to those of a desert?

There are <u>more</u> species in the savannah because there are <u>more</u> food sources.



There are <u>less</u> species in the desert because there are <u>less</u> food sources.




The climate in **habitats** effects what animals live there and what plants can grow.


