## 1. Who should be King?

- To be able to explain how Henry V11 united both houses by marrying Elizabeth of York and started the Tudor dynasty.

## 3. Who is in charge of the church in England?

- To explain why the reformation happened in England and what happened as a result of it, both for the king and for the country.

### What caused the conflict between the Catholics and the Protestants?

- To begin to understand that the reformation didn't just happen in England but was part of something bigger happening in other parts of Europe. To also see how this religious change, caused lots of religious conflict.

### What is Protestantism, how is it different from Catholicism?

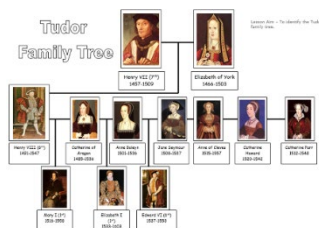
- To know what Protestantism means and how it is different from Catholicism.
